1. CALL TO ORDER

Advisor (Acting Band Manager) Boyd Clark called the meeting to order at 6:15 PM MDT. All of Council was present.

2. **Health & Social Development Advisor: Child & Family File Updates and Concern**

Mandy Cormier provided an overview of the various files and the concerns. A youth **in care** (Fort St. John) was hospitalized last week for a suicide attempt. The Province of British Columbia's Ministry of Child and Family Development ("MCFD") is working on permanent placement with the foster parents; working on a cultural safety agreement with the foster parents, social worker, and eventually it will need to go to Council for approval. A child in care (Alberta) was sexually abused **in care** last year and is expected to testify in court this month (the child is 8-years old). We were not notified of this until Mandy met with the social workers in October about an unrelated matter and the incident came up in a conversation. One of Acho Dene members had their child removed in the summer (child was not a member yet, but the paperwork had started), and her child died in the care of MCFD. There is an on-going investigation into this situation involving her lawyer and RCMP, Mandy was supporting the family at the beginning, but she has since stopped communication. Two children were removed from their parents in May 2024 (Nanaimo), and Mandy will be attending court this week to discuss the next steps. The court documents for this file appeared to be sent to Assistant Band Manager, but there was no further involvement from Acho Dene Koe First Nation (i.e., attending court as requested). We have received court notices for May 29, 2024, and September 25, 2024. Mandy is meeting with the social worker this afternoon to discuss my concerns further. There are serious concerns with the Ministry of Child and Family Development notifying Acho Dene Koe First Nation. Mandy noted that while it is understood and appreciated that each file is in a different region and/or province, they still are required to follow the Federal Legislation when it comes to

engaging with and notifying First Nations.

Consensus of Council: Mandy to draft a letter for Ministry of Child and Family Services (British Columbia) and all related other provincial and territorial jurisdictions.

Mandy Cormier leaves the meeting [6:45 pm].

3. **Employee Garnishee**

Boyd Clark provided an overview of the status of the file concerning employee garnishment by Housing NWT. The employee has agreed to have Boyd represent them with discussions of settlement with Housing NWT's legal counsel – seeking to reduce the monthly commitment. Currently waiting for legal counsel (Field Law) to get direction from their client. Concern that if the garnishee amount remains as ordered by Court that the employee will resign to reduce the amount of garnishee.

4. **Employee Resignation: McLeod**

Boyd Clark provided notice to Council that Mikala McLeod has submitted her resignation. Acting Band Manager will post the position with closing early January.

5. **Employees: Notice of Layoff**

Boyd Clark reports on the file.

WHEREAS

It has been reported to Chief and Council that Acho Dene Koe First Nation doesn't have the funding to support the cost of the current payroll and programs. Due to funding shortage, a recommendation to Chief and Council was provided to immediately provide *Notice of Layoff* to the employees and this recommendation was supported by a Band Council Resolution at the October 17, 2024, meeting of Council. Under the instruction of Chief and Council, the Assistant Band Manager is to provide:

Notice of Layoff October 18, 2024.

The *Notice of Layoff* is due to shortage of work which should all employees the ability to immediately access unemployment insurance and so we encourage all employees to register with Service Canada as early as possible.

WHEREAS

The *Notice of Layoff* is effective today, and is a 7-day notice, the last day of work will be October 25th, and the *Notice of Layoff* is for employees employed in the following division of program and services, a complete list is included on the need page:

- Community Wellness Program
- Culture & On-the-Land
- Elders Support

As funding is secured, that support the positions that have been given the *Notice of Layoff* then a *Notice of Recall* will be provided; however unfortunately we have no timeline as to when this occurs.

6. **Acho Dene Koe First Nation v. Paramount Resources**

Boyd Clark reports on the file. Discussion ensued. The Court confirmed on October 28, 2024, that the summary judgment motion has been set for hearing on June 3, 2025.

9. **Yukon Government Notification: Contaminants Discharged Water – Abandoned Wolverine Mine**

The Lands Office provided noticed that the Yukon government notified about a suspected tailing discharge in the headwaters of the Liard River at the abandoned Wolverine Mine between Watson Lake and Ross River. The Lands Office reported that they have requested more information on the level of contaminants that were detected, however, as this is quite far upstream from the Liard River, suspect contaminants would be diluted by the time they reach the Liard River in the Yukon and certainly by the time they enter Acho Dene Traditional territory. Based on the early information provided by Yukon the Land's Office doesn't see this being of any concern to Acho Dene Koe First Nation. The Lands Office committed to keep following this to better understand if there is anything for Chief and Council to be concerned about. Discussion ensued.

Consensus of Council: Council requests of the Lands Office to have Guardians perform water sampling for at least 30-days.

10. **Council: Election Code: Section 26**

The council raised a discussion concerning Councillor Villeneuve's residency requirements per Section 26 of the Election Code. Vanessa Villeneuve reported that she will be moving in January to Fort Liard to take care of her elderly grandma and feels that the timing still satisfies Section 26 requirements of the Election Code.

Vanessa Villeneuve is declared in conflict and leaves the meeting.

The council discusses the requirements of the Election Code.

Consensus of Council: To provide notice to Vanessa Villeneuve that the Council will be removing her from the office of council and providing notice to the members of a pending by-election.

Vanessa Villeneuve returns to the meeting.

Chief Hope, on behalf of the Council, provides notice to Vanessa that the Council must follow the Election Code and the residency requirements of Council representatives. He encourages Vanessa to submit her interest for a position on Council once the nominations are sought in the by-election for the vacant seat on Council. Vanessa thanks Council and informs that she the intention to submit her interest for the by-election.

Vanessa Villeneuve is removed from Council immediately for violation of Section 26 of the Election Code of Acho Dene Koe First Nation, she leaves the meeting [8:35 pm].

Discussion of Council concerning the Information Release.

Consensus of Council: To provide an Information Release to Acho Dene Koe First Nation members of the following:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN TO MEMBERS TO THE REMOVAL OF A COUNCILLOR AND THE PENDING ANNOUNCEMENT OF BY ELECTION.

The Chief and Council, with regret, to uphold its obligations to adhere to the October 20, 2022, Election Code ("Election Code"), passed a Resolution of Council to remove Councillor Vanessa Villeneuve from her position on Council due to violation of the Election Code ratified by the members of Acho Dene Koe First Nation. The decision of Council was not taken lightly by Council and was made at the duly convened meeting of November 28, 2024. The decision to remove Ms. Villeneuve was due to the Councillor failing to have residency in Fort Liard in accordance with Section 26 and all subsequent Sections of the Election Code.

Section 26

Requires that all individuals wishing to run for office, he/she/they must indicate in writing their intention to relocate their primary residence to the community of Fort Liard within sixty (60) days of the publication of the final election results. As of the date of the November 28, 2024, meeting of Council Ms. Villeneuve had failed to provide proof of permanent residency in Fort Liard. The Council declared a vacancy of Council due to Ms. Villeneuve being unable to meet the requirements of Section 71c).

Section 71c

A vacancy shall be declared on Council when a Council member:

c) Is unable to meet the requirement of relocating to Fort Liard within the stated timeframe.

BY-ELECTION

The Council will be holding a By-Election, dates to be determined, and to be announced in December for a 2025 By-Election. The By-Election is called in accordance with Section 73 and Section 75 of the Election Code.

Section 73:

If "runner-up(s)" is/are not available to assume a position on Council, a by-election will be called to fill the position.

Section 75:

Vacancies longer than six (6) months shall be ordered filled by Council either by: a) Appointing to fill out the remainder of the term the candidate who received the next highest number of votes in the previous election; or b) Holding a by-election for the position if the next candidate/s per Section 75a above is/are unwilling or unavailable.

Exception: In case of a vacancy longer than six (6) months created by the removal from office of an elected official, the vacancy thus created must be filled by a by-election.

Boyd Clark provided an overview to the issue of the Government of Northwest Territories pursuing the recovery of municipal property taxes due and offsetting with funds that would typically be paid to Acho Dene Koe First Nation band members for medical travel, social assistance, etc. Discussion ensued. Boyd informed that a demand to include on the next meeting of Negotiations with Canada and Government of Northwest Territories and that the Advisor of Council has raised the concerns with the Principal Secretary to the Premier. At the time of Minutes, no response has been given by the Government of Northwest Territories. Will wait to the response from the negotiations table prior to taking to the media and seeking inclusion on the next Council of Leaders agenda.

- e. Northwest Territories Project Finance for Permanence Opportunity: Partners Table: Officials Appointment

Section 6.2 of the Our Land for the Future Agreement notes that the Partners Table has oversight and is responsible for implementing the Agreement in a manner that is reflective of Indigenous values and benefits to Indigenous communities, other residents of the Northwest Territories, and other Canadians. Specific tasks for which the Partners Table is responsible include ensuring proper accountability and oversight of the management and disbursements from the Our Land for the Future Trust; approving annual operating plans, annual budgets, and relevant Fund Management Policies; and any other activities as may be agreed by the Partners to advance the Agreement. The full list of Partner Table responsibilities as outlined in the Agreement is appended to this letter. In the short term, the Partners Table will play a key role in ensuring that all relevant conditions on contributions to the Trust have been addressed, with the goal of ensuring that funds can flow into the Trust and then out to Indigenous governments as soon as possible. We propose that the nominated Partner Table representative from Acho Dene Koe First Nation: Be a senior-level official, with authority to represent the interests of your government; Have a strong understanding of your government's engagement to date as well as their needs and interests related to early implementation; Have experience with establishing implementation and/or relevant oversight bodies; and have capacity to prioritize involvement over the next 6-12 months. They anticipate the Partners Table will meet 2-3 times between December 2024 and April 2025, with meetings then occurring 1-2 times a year as the OLF Trust and associated committees are established, and key staff are hired.

Discussion ensued. The Advisor to Council indicated that he could serve as Acho Dene Koe First Nation's representative if it was desire of Council. Chief Hope asked whether the Advisor had the capacity to serve with all other activities involved with for Council. It was agreed that to find an alternative person to serve.
